All papers submitted must be previously unpublished and may not be considered for publication elsewhere at any time during the review period. Any accepted paper included in the final program is expected to have at least one author or qualified proxy attend and present the paper at the conference.

A. Special Session Proposal

Special session proposal must include a topical title, rationale, session outline, contact information, and a list of invited speakers. Special session authors are referred to our website for additional information regarding submissions.

1) *Venue and Transportation*: The 6th Biomedical Engineering International Conference (BMEiCON 2013) will be hosted at Krabi Resort (www.krabi-resort.net), Krabi, Thailand. The venue is located in Ao Nang. It is about 30 km or about 30 minutes away by car from Krabi International Airport (KBV). In addition, it is about 16 km or about 15 minutes away by car from Krabi city. Krabi Resort has a long and beautiful private beach on the Andaman seaside.

III. HOW TO GET TO KRABI

Both getting to and getting around Krabi is quite easy. Visitors to Krabi may arrive by air, bus, car, or boat from destinations both north and south of Krabi, as well as from Phuket and Phang Nga provinces to the west of Krabi.

A. By Air

Daily flights from Bangkok operate by Thai Airways International (www.thaiairways.com) Thai Air Asia (www.airasia.com). The trip takes 1.20 hours. Fly'n Ride operated by Nok Air. Fly'n Ride means that you fly with Nok Air from Bangkok (Don Mueang) to Trang then with a convenient connection by coach to Krabi. B. By Bus

IV. HOW TO GET TO AO NANG

A. From Krabi International Airport

B. Local shuttle buses
